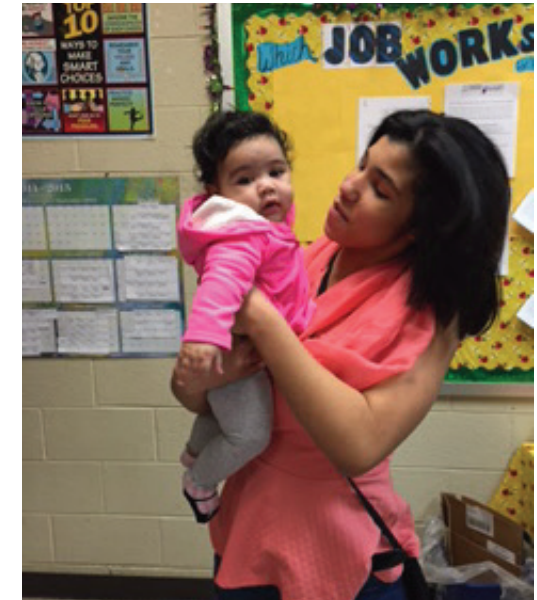

**Pregnant and Parenting  
Youth Program  
(PPYP)**



Offered at two MPS high schools, PPYP provides resources and services to students expecting a child or who are already parenting a child. PPYP offers academic, health/wellness and social/emotional supports to ensure students graduate from high school and are ready to pursue college or a career.



## Pregnant and Parenting Youth Program (PPYP)

PPYP services are available to school-age parents (young fathers, mothers and students who are expecting) to improve the educational, wellness and social/emotional outcomes for families.



### PPYP Goals

- ▶ Increase attendance and graduation rates.
- ▶ Increase teen enrollment in higher education.
- ▶ Increase knowledge of effective parenting practices.
- ▶ Increase knowledge and practices around healthy relationships.
- ▶ Enhance coordination of school and community services.



### PPYP Services

- ▶ Case management services to facilitate access to and participation in needed resources and services.
- ▶ Academic supports for students to progress toward graduation, including home/hospital instruction for periods when school age parent is unable to attend school due to special medical needs.
- ▶ Counseling services including vocational, career and college planning as well as personal and social supports.
- ▶ Nursing services including prenatal assessments, instruction on reproductive health, pregnancy options, child development, infant and child care, nutrition, and referrals to community resources.

### PPYP Team

Trained professionals are able to assist and provide resources and support.

- ▶ School Social Worker
- ▶ Para-professional Assistants
- ▶ Registered Nurses
- ▶ Licensed Teachers
- ▶ School Counselor

Note: All services are provided utilizing a team approach including school staff along with the student and his or her significant others.
